Cardington Township held their regular meeting on February 13, 2023 at 7:00 PM in the township office. The meeting was opened with pledge to flag and prayer by Heacock.

Trustees: Heacock Patterson Green

Fiscal Officer: Hardwick.
Zoning Inspector: Robinson.
Employees: Bouillon and Moss.

Others: Gary Goodman, Steven Hummell Jr., and Cinnamon Potter

MINUTES:

* Hardwick read the minutes of the January 9th meeting. Heacock moved, Patterson seconded, to approve the minutes as read. Roll Call: Heacock yes, Patterson yes, Green yes.

DISCUSSION:

* Gary Goodman, Village of Cardington Fire Department Chief, provided 2022 fire department statistics. He has applied and received \$14,000 in grants last year for such items as tools and a rip pack. Mark Mathews just received his 40-year pin for years of service. Other local fire departments are having to employ day staff; Cardington has not yet. They have a strong volunteer base. He will look into replacing fire levies versus renewing them in order to increase revenue to keep up with increasing costs.

FINANCIAL:

- * The following bills were presented to the board for examination (listed at end of minutes): 16718-16743 and electronic payment 2 (check 16741 was voided). Heacock moved, Patterson seconded, to approve said bills. Roll Call: Heacock yes, Patterson yes, Green yes.
- * Hardwick presented the Township's Cash Summary by Fund report and Fund Status report. The January bank reconciliation was distributed for signing by the board. Heacock moved, Patterson seconded, to accept them as submitted. Roll Call: Heacock yes, Patterson yes, Green yes.

ZONING

- *#483 Brock & Cassidy Goodman, TR 138 house cost of construction \$250,000 fee \$150.
- * Robinson reported that neighbors made a complaint about Maniaci property on CR149. He drove by; there is at least one vehicle not tagged and many mowers behind the house. Hummell and Potter expressed their frustration about the property. They will continue to communicate to new county treasurer and assistant county prosecutor.
- * Hardwick reported that the lot split for the County Parks has not been paid. She emailed the invoice to Dixie Shinaberry, board member. Shinaberry submitted the invoice to the County Commissioners for payment.

ROADS:

- * Trustees and Bouillon discussed the sessions they attended at the OTA conference.
- * Moss said the Children At Play road signs are old and in bad shape. When they were first installed, the children are probably not children anymore. Trustees said to take them down; then, put new ones up if residents ask for them. Moss plans to replace the Stop

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Ahead road signs. Road crew have worked on ditches and straightening signs. They plan to start patching potholes.

- * Strawser provided pricing for microsurfacing and crack sealing. They require a minimum 15,000 square feet to microsurface. The price to microsurface TR28 & TR136 would be \$117,000. The price to crack seal most township roads would be \$52,000 or certain roads would be \$11,000.
- * The County Engineer has ordered the tube for the culvert at TR144 and CR125. Township will get estimates for excavation work.
- * Summer road work will be paving TR66 (between SR529 and CR137) and chip & seal TR139 (between CR66 and CR134). Hardwick will place an ad in the Sentinel for bids.

EQUIPMENT:

- * The hydraulic lines on the mower need replaced. The dump truck was repaired by Axthelm.
- * Trustees obtained three quotes for dump trucks from three vendors at state-bid pricing.

Based on previous experience with Ford, especially lack of customer service and maintenance for recalls, the trustees are leaning away from Ford. The Freightliner quote is lower than Kenworth. Trustees will talk to others who have a Freightliner truck for their input. Heacock and Moss will physically go look at these trucks in order to make a more informed recommendation. Trustees may call a special meeting in order to move forward since these quotes are only good for a limited number of days. None of these trucks are readily available; they must be ordered. Trustees also received a quote from The Dexter Company to outfit the Freightliner truck for snow plowing; the cost is \$81,050.

MISC:

- * Heacock designated Patterson to represent Cardington Township at the Morrow County Health District Advisory Council on March 2.
- * Trustees debated a renewal levy versus a replacement levy for the roads. The levy currently generates approximately \$52,035. A replacement would increase to \$69,061. With current price increases to maintain roads, trustees favor a replacement levy.
- * Patterson moved, Heacock seconded, to replace the road levy for the purpose of general construction, reconstruction, resurfacing and repair of streets, road and bridges in Cardington Township, pursuant to Section 5705.19 (G) of the Ohio Revised Code, at a rate not exceeding 1.0 mill for each one dollar of valuation for five years commencing 2024, first due in calendar year 2025. This will be for the general election on November 7, 2023. Roll Call: Heacock yes, Patterson yes, Green yes.
- * The quote for two exterior doors for the township garage from Lowe's is \$1,291.83. The Township will get a quote for installation.
- * Heacock moved, Patterson seconded, to adjourn into executive session in accordance with O.R.C. 121.22 (G)(2) to consider the appointment, employment, dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, or compensation of a public employee or official. Executive session included elected officials at 8:45. Roll Call: Heacock yes, Patterson yes, Green yes.
